### RIVERTON FFA MEMBER ELECTED AS STATE FFA OFFICER

CHEYENNE—Riverton FFA member Bradon Marshall was elected as the 2011-2012 Wyoming State FFA Third Vice President on April 7, at the Wyoming State FFA Convention in Cheyenne.

Marshall was one of nine students chosen to lead the Wyoming FFA Association for the coming year. Fulfilling his role will require traveling across the state; meeting top leaders in business, government and education; visiting Wyoming's 47 FFA chapters; and participating in events like the Wyoming FFA Leadership Camp and the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Ind. Marshall's responsibilities will include providing personal growth and leadership training for students, setting policies that shape the future of the organization and promoting agricultural literacy.

The state FFA officer selection process is intense, and represents an assessment of years of academic and extracurricular accomplishments made by each student. Nominees submitted an application detailing their accomplishments and contributions to their chapter and community. Once at the convention, candidates participated in five rounds of interviews, testing their knowledge on FFA matters and demonstrating their leadership and career skills. The officers are selected by a panel of five student FFA members.

Marshall was one of 25 students running for state office. His state officer year will begin with a five-day training conference in May. The other officers elected were Asher Markworth, President, Casper; Courtney Yelton, Vice President, Laramie; Jac Klaahsen, Second Vice President, Buffalo; Tanner Nauta, Third Vice President, Douglas; Molly McCray, Secretary, Powell-Shoshone; Abbey Davidson, Reporter, Encampment; Jessica Olson, Sentinel, Devils Tower; and Faith Hoffman, Parliamentarian, Wind River.

His FFA advisor is Casey Styvar.

This national youth organization has 523,309 student members as part of 7,487 local FFA chapters in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.
